

COSMETOLOGY TRAINING:

1800 hours

Course objective: This program will prepare students for entry level positions in the cosmetology field that will enable them to perform the services normally performed in the cosmetology profession. The program is divided into three areas of study – Barbering/Styling, Chemical Services and Manicuring/Skin Care.

1. 300 hours THEORY – Related textbook study.
2. 100 hours MANICURING AND PEDICURING – Skills in the application of manicuring and pedicuring services, excluding the application and removal of sculptured or artificial nails.
3. 100 hours SKIN CARE AND TEMPORARY REMOVAL OF HAIR – Skills in the application of esthetics services limited to toning the skin of the scalp, stimulating the skin of the body by use of preparations, tonics, lotions, or creams, and tinting of the eyebrows and lashes, removal of hair by use of depilatories, waxing or tweezing and makeup application.
4. 50 hours SHAMPOOING – Including draping, brushing of the hair, scalp manipulations, conditioning and rinsing.
5. 10 hours SCALP AND HAIR ANALYSIS – Diseases and disorders of the scalp, hair, skin and nails.
6. 175 hours HAIR CUTTING AND TRIMMING – Including scissors, razor, thinning shears and clippers. Cutting and trimming of facial hair including beard and mustache design and eyebrow, ear and nose hair trimming, waxing and tweezing.
7. 290 hours HAIR STYLING AND ARRANGING – Including wet, dry and thermal styling, and styling aids.
8. 50 hours ARTIFICIAL HAIR – May include extensions and fitting.
9. 250 hours PERMANENT WAVING – Including sectioning, wrapping, preperm test curl, solution application, processing test curl and neutralizing.
10. 50 hours CHEMICAL RELAXING – Including sectioning, strand test, relaxer application, and removal of chemicals.
11. 115 hours HAIR COLORING OR BLEACHING – Techniques including predisposition test, strand test, measurement, mixing, application and removal of chemicals.
12. 70 hours SANITATION – Disinfecting of individual work stations, individual equipment and tools and proper use and storage of linens.

SAFETY - Including proper use and storage of chemicals, implements and electrical appliances.

13. 40 hours FIRST AID – As it relates to cosmetology, barbering, manicuring and esthetics.

Methods of instruction will vary depending on the subject material, lectures, demonstrations, and hands-on experiences with an emphasis on safety and sanitation.

NO MORE THAN TWENTY-FIVE PERCENT OF ALL SERVICES WILL BE PERFORMED USING MANNEQUINS.

Upon successful completion, the student will be able to demonstrate:

RAZOR CUTTING: Correct use of the razor and various techniques, including safety and sanitation precautions.

SCISSOR CUTTING: Correct use of the scissors and various techniques, including safety and sanitation precautions.

WET STYLING: Proper methods of roller setting, finger waving, pincurls, backcombing, smoothing of styles, design and control, including all safety and sanitation precautions.

THERMAL STYLING: Proper use of a blowdryer, curling iron, crimping iron, also product knowledge for products used in the school, including all safety and sanitation precautions.

SHAMPOOING: Proper draping procedure, brushing and scalp manipulations, all types of products to be used, disease and disorders of the scalp, including all safety and sanitation precautions.

SCALP TREATMENTS: Proper examination of the scalp, manipulations on the scalp, including all safety and sanitation precautions.

PERMANENT WAVING: Proper hair and scalp analysis, chemistry of the hair, consultations, sectioning, wrapping and sub sections, processing, test curls, neutralizing along with safety and sanitary precautions.

CHEMICAL RELAXING: Proper hair and scalp analysis, sectioning, application and sub sections, processing, neutralizing, product knowledge, including safety and sanitary precautions.

TINTING: Basic knowledge of primary, secondary, and tertiary colors, the color wheel, the 12 levels of color, and the application of semi-permanent color, virgin and retouch, timing test strands and removal, corrective procedures, product knowledge and safe and sanitary precautions.

LIGHTENING: Seven states of bleach, application of virgin and retouches and removal, foil and meshes (cap), corrective procedures, application and removal of toners and safety and sanitary precautions.

MANICURING AND PEDICURING: Including nail diseases and disorders, and all safety and sanitary precautions.

FACIALS: Proper draping, cleansing the face, facial manipulation, machine facials, manual facials, skin diseases, disorders, skin conditions, including all safety and sanitation precautions.

PACKS AND MASKS: Appropriate draping, analyzing skin conditions for proper use of packs and masks, including safety and sanitary precautions.

ARCHING AND WAXING: Correct procedures in arching and waxing, patron protection including safety and sanitary precautions.

LASH AND BROW TINTING: Correct procedures for the application, patron protection, including all safety and sanitary precautions.

MAKE-UP: Proper color draping, application of make-up, lessons, patron protection including all safety and sanitary precautions.

SALON MANAGEMENT: How to seek and obtain employment, payroll deductions, preparation of employment applications, knowledge of laws and regulations governing salon operation.
