

Student Data Transfer

Beginning with the 2003-04 school year, Bremerton School District will comply with a state mandate to upload student data files to the Superintendent of Public Instruction's office each month. Each student will be assigned a Secure Student Identifier number, and their demographics, attendance, and grade information will be tracked. OSPI will be using the information for research and student achievement data. Complete details of this program can be found on the district's web page, www.bremertonschools.org. Parents have the right to opt out of the transfer of information by sending a written note to the building principal.

Weapons are not allowed

Weapons, or anything that looks like a weapon, are not allowed at school, on any district property, or at any event sponsored by any school or by the school district. If a student brings a weapon to school, the police will be called and the student will be immediately expelled. Depending on circumstances, the student could be expelled from all Washington state public schools for up to 180 days. Policy 4210.
